In May and June 2019 major building works will be carried out on the A10 Zuid and the adjacent rail network. If you are planning to travel anywhere during this period, by road or by public transport, then please allow for additional travel time, road closures and diversions. Delays of up to an hour should be expected.

Building works on the A10 Zuid and rail network

1. Friday evening 10 May 10pm to Monday morning 13 May 5am
2. Friday evening 17 May 10pm to Monday morning 20 May 5am
3. Friday evening 24 May 10pm to Monday morning 27 May 5am
4. Friday evening 31 May 10pm to Monday morning 3 June 5am
5. Friday evening 7 June 10pm to **Tuesday** morning 11 June 5am (**Pentecost**)

Road closures will start to take effect from 9pm on Fridays.

A4 & A10 Zuid

During these weekends, parts of the A4 and A10 Zuid will be closed. Coming from the north (A8) heading in the direction of Utrecht (A2), you can travel via A10 Oost. For the direction Schiphol/The Hague you can take your usual route. Coming from A4/Schiphol, the motorway (A4 and A10 Zuid) will be closed from junction Badhoevedorp. You will be diverted via the A5 and A9. Access route S109 remains open during all weekends. The A10 Zuid will also remain open for traffic in the direction of the A4 (Schiphol).

Train

No trains will travel to, from or through Amsterdam Zuid and Amsterdam RAI stations during these weekends, apart from the last weekend (Pentecost) when a very limited schedule will be operating. You can travel via Amsterdam Central Station instead, or use the metro and tram.

Zuidasdok

All of this is necessary to accommodate work on the extension of Amsterdam Zuid station, which is part of the overarching Zuidasdok project. This project also entails the widening – from four to six lanes – of the A10 Zuid between junctions De Nieuwe Meer and Amstel. Part of the A10 Zuid will be transferred underground, and a fully renewed Amsterdam Zuid station will be realised on top of it. Over the Pentecost weekend, a huge roof will be slid into place. This roof is part of an additional passageway underneath Amsterdam Zuid station.

More disruption

In addition to these five weekends in May and June, there will be a few more weekends with reduced train and metro travel to and from Amsterdam Zuid and Amsterdam RAI stations. The journey planning applications have been updated to facilitate your planning.
